In 2023 alone, Side Street hosted or produced:

- 108 free or low-cost off-site arts education events reaching over 4000 young artists
- 502 free or low-cost, on-site arts education events reaching over 1000 artists
- 25 visual art exhibitions featuring over 300 artists
- 55 on and off-site professional development opportunities for SSSA staff and area artists
- 140 performance events reaching over 4000 audience members
- 400+ hours of donated and discounted space for creative events for area organizations, artists, and individuals
- Paid out over \$46,000 to area visual and performing artists through the Gallery, MADE, and numerous additional professional opportunities
- 1 Artist-in-Residence; 3 Artist/Arts Administration Internships
- 15 Farmers Market Appearances
- Hosted our 2nd year of the Nightmare On Chicago Street Costume Contest
- 10th annual Elgin Fringe Festival in collaboration with the Elgin Cultural Arts Commission
- Continued CONNECTED, our podcast series featuring conversations with creatives
- Acted as the umbrella organization for ELGbtq+, which won an Elgin Image Award for Game Changing Project for Elgin's first-ever Pride Parade and Festival in June
 - And reached a huge milestone of having paid out over \$1 million to artists since our opening in 2013.




